Notice of Financial Assistance

Danville Regional Medical Center is proud of its mission to provide quality healthcare to all who need it. We may be able to assist you if you do not have health insurance and are unable to pay for your care.

Danville Regional Medical Center provides financial assistance to patients based on their level of income, total acquired assets and general need. In addition we will assist you in applying for medical assistance programs or work with you to arrange a manageable payment plan. In fact, a State Social Services Eligibility Worker that is located on our campus to help patients enroll in the various assistance programs could contact you.

Patients meeting our charity care guidelines could have their hospital bill waived in full for non-elective care.

One of the most important things that you can do is let us know if you will have trouble paying your medical bill.

Danville Regional Medical Center Charity Guidelines

In order to be approved for charity, patients will need to meet the following requirements:

🕒 Have no ability to pay their account balance

And

🕒 Income must meet 200% or below of the current the Federal Poverty Guidelines

Eligibility for CHARITY is limited to persons whose **GROSS (before any deductions) FAMILY income** is not more than the Federal Poverty Income Guidelines in effect at the time the service is rendered.

The 2010 Poverty Income Guidelines for Virginia Are:

1	\$ 10,830	\$ 903
2	\$ 14,570	\$ 1,215
3	\$ 18,310	\$ 1,526
4	\$ 22,050	\$ 1,838
5	\$ 25,790	\$ 2,150

Charity eligibility will be determined by review of the Financial Profile, Charity Application, documents presented in support of the information on the Profile and Application and verification of assets.

Charity eligibility encompasses the following patients: Patients without health insurance that have not met eligibility criteria for any State assistance program through the Department of Medical Assistance. Patients are United States Citizens.

Charity awards are not based solely on income. Unique financial circumstances are weighed and assets will be verified. These factors can change the category of eligibility.

The decision as to the amount of charity write-off will be made collectively by the Business Office Director and the Chief Financial Officer. Elective or non-medically necessary services are not eligible for charity consideration.
